MINUTES

The meeting was chaired by Tony Troughton.

1. Minutes of previous meeting (11th January 2010)

The minutes were accepted as being accurate.

2. Burglary

Steve Parker revealed that the crime figures in the last month have been very low and that two people had been arrested following one burglary in the village.

3. Anti Social Driving

No problems with Anti Social Driving reported since the last meeting. Jen Sams mentioned that parking was still an issue in Ouseley Road and that people were actually leaving their cars there to go on holiday via the local bus service that goes to Terminal 5 at Heathrow Airport. She also mentioned that there was an untaxed car parked/left there.

4. Anti Social behaviour

No anti social behaviour was reported. The Police have just finished a nine day operation in the Recreation Ground but reported no real problems and only some alcohol being seized from some local youths.

5. AOB

Police Post. The Chairman and Inspector Dalton were due to meet with TVPA representatives on December 23rd to discuss the conversion of the old toilet block in to a Police Post. The meeting was cancelled due to adverse weather conditions. It now appears that TVPA feel that converting the bulk of the building in to a Police Post would provide a space in excess of their requirements. The provisional design has therefore been modified to allow the space previously allocated to the Police Post to be used as a Parish Council Office. The space currently used as a Parish office in the Church Road Parish meeting Room is unsuitable for this purpose as it is impossible to heat to meet the requirements of the relevant legislation. Under this revised proposal the Police Post would be housed in an extension to the existing building using one space in the adjacent car park. This space is currently unused because of access problems. The building would therefore serve a triple purpose comprising two

refurbished single occupancy public toilets, a centrally located Parish Office and a Police Post at the southern end using a common entrance with the Parish Office. Comments are awaited from the TVPA about this proposal and in particular clarification of their space requirements.
